Dear friends,

There are many faces of hunger here in central Alabama. In the 12-counties we serve, hunger affects our neighbors, whether down the street, in the workplace, or families in our own communities.

We provided over **21 million meals** last year to our neighbors facing hunger, the most in our 41-year history! We didn't think that it was possible to distribute that much food from our 60,000 square foot warehouse. While that is an extraordinary number, the estimated meals needed to meet the meal gap in our 12 counties is over 33 million annually. We are committed to meeting that need.

Our mission is to feed our neighbors in need today and foster collaborative solutions to end hunger tomorrow. 1-in-5 people are food insecure across our 12-county service area, which includes 1-in-4 children. We work each day to change this, and we can't do it without you.

Our mission is made possible thanks to remarkable volunteers, generous donors, hardworking staff, devoted board members, and over 350 distribution partners working each day to serve their communities. We are better together. It truly takes all of us.

We hope these pages reflect our deepest gratitude to you, our partners. We are committed to expanding our impact in the years to come as we anticipate the demand for food assistance to grow in the next decade. I know we can do more for our neighbors facing hunger throughout central Alabama. Let's build hope and fight hunger, one meal at a time.

HOPE FOR PEARLIE

Across central Alabama, nearly 10% of our senior neighbors are unsure where their next meal may come from. Pearlie, who faces this reality, found hope in the work of the Community Food Bank through our partnership with The Bridge at Servant of Jesus Church in Anniston, AL.

Pearlie's journey to the food bank began two years ago when her neighbor Arlene introduced her to the Senior Grocery Mobile Pantry Program.

Living alone in Calhoun County after relocating from Colbert County, Pearlie counts on monthly food distributions to make ends meet. The assistance she receives isn't just about filling her pantry; it is about

survival. Living on a fixed income, Pearlie emphasizes, **"It's life-saving."**

Despite her own challenges, Pearlie's heart overflows with generosity. Due to dietary restrictions, she often shares extra food with her neighbors and friends from church, ensuring that no food goes to waste.

NAUVOO SERVES

Sometimes the smallest seed can turn into a bountiful harvest. The fruits of one seed planted in the heart of Walker County are evident on the 3rd Saturday of every month, when the community rallies together to distribute over 22,500 pounds of food to their neighbors.

In 2008, Carole Newman and Roger Watkins began Christian's Place Mission in Nauvoo, AL, a once prosperous coal mining town. Their mission began with a \$2.38 canned ham and a prayer to be able to serve one family in the community. Through the 13-year partnership between the Community Food Bank and Christian's Place Mission, their agency now feeds an average of 450 neighbors every month.

While the residents of Nauvoo face many challenges, Tam Owen, Director of Christian's Place Mission, is grateful the Community Food Bank can provide food assistance, allowing Christian's Place Mission to also provide other necessities like clothing and school supplies that their community needs.

Our partners know their neighbors best - we leverage their knowledge to tailor food choices and services specifically to the needs of their communities. We connect our network through annual county level meetings and an Agency Advisory Council to hear the perspective of our partners and neighbors. In October, we hosted the Better Together Partner Engagement Conference to provide resources, peer-to-peer learning, and build relationships. These partnerships led to a total of 25,322,038 pounds of food distributed to our neighbors across our 12-county service area.

RECLAIMING FOOD

At the Community Food Bank, food reclamation is a vital source of nutritious, quality food for our neighbors. Some of the same food reclaimed from retailers, including Publix, Walmart, Piggly-Wiggly, and more, is sent directly to our warehouse in Birmingham, AL. However, we also leverage our partnerships with local retailers by directly connecting our agency partners. One such partnership between the Community Food Bank, Samaritan House, and Walmart #432 in Talladega does just that.

Samaritan House, an agency partner in Talladega, was established in 1988. The food they receive from this partnership allows them to **“serve 15-25 families each day,”**

says Charles Montgomery, co-director of Samaritan House. Last year, Samaritan House received over 130,000 pounds of food from the Community Food Bank to distribute to their community. In 2022, Walmart Store #432 began donating product. Last year it donated over 16,000 pounds of food to Samaritan house.

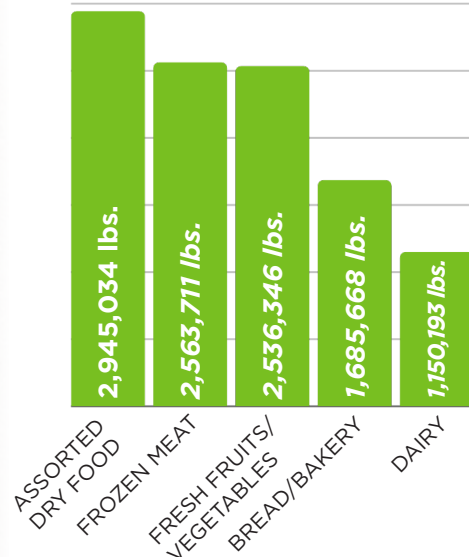
In 2023, our total reclamation efforts saved over 11,000,000 pounds from local and national retailers. Our fleet of trucks operates five days a week, collecting fresh produce, meats, dairy products, and more from local retailers, preventing millions of pounds of wholesome food from being wasted in landfills.



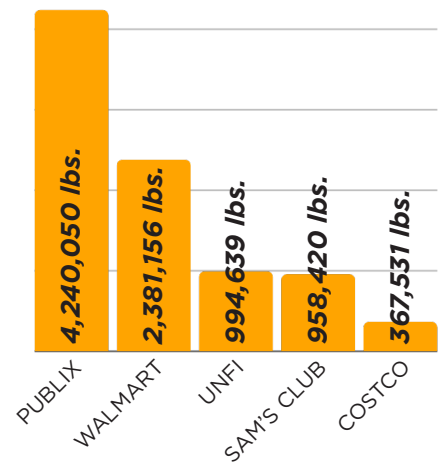

These unsung heroes come from all walks of life, driven by a common purpose: to make a meaningful difference in the lives of our neighbors facing hunger.

One of the most remarkable aspects of the Community Food Bank's volunteer program is the diversity of individuals it attracts. Volunteers span across generations, ranging from elementary school students eager to give back, to retirees looking for a way to stay engaged and make a positive impact in their community. This rich array of experiences and perspectives creates a vibrant atmosphere where people from all walks of life come together for a common cause.

In addition to the invaluable contributions of individual volunteers, the Community Food Bank also relies on the support of corporate partners, civic organizations, and faith-based groups. These collaborative efforts further amplify the impact of the food bank's work, enabling it to reach more people and communities in need. In 2023, over 9,000 volunteers entered our warehouse to contribute to our mission.

Vestavia Hills High School Life Skills class consistently volunteers at our warehouse twice a week during the school year. Their class of 13, a mix of students and teachers, sorts donations and packs boxes for upcoming distributions.

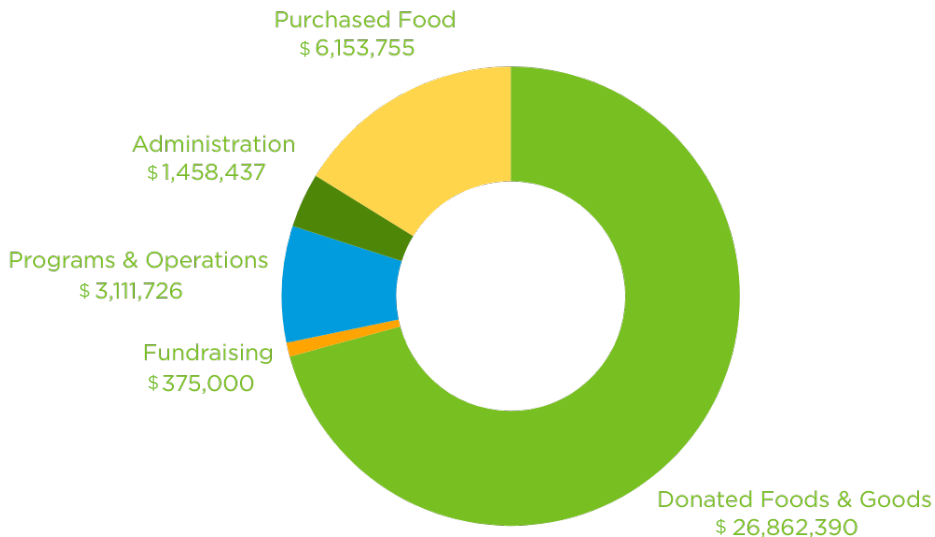

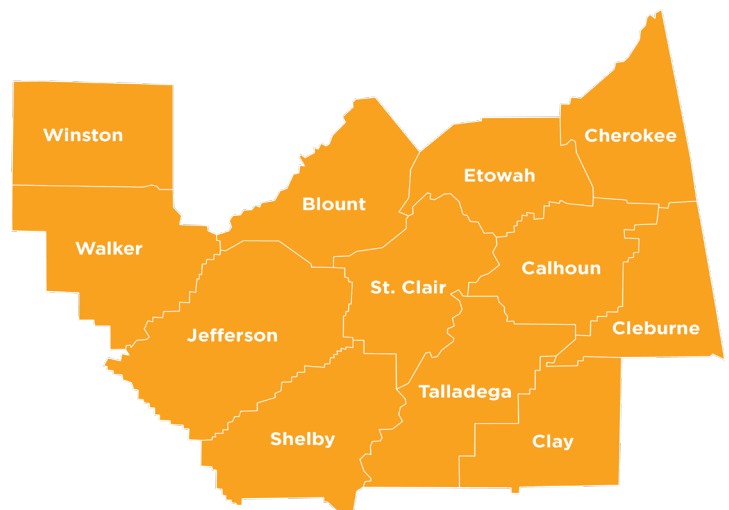
